DISTRICT OF BARRIERE MINUTES OF A BMX INTEREST MEETING Held on Tuesday, June 1, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. In the Council Chambers at Municipal Hall 4936 Barriere Town Road

Barriere, B.C.

Councillor Kershaw called the meeting to order at 7:00pm

1. PURPOSE OF MEETING

Councillor Kershaw briefly outlined that in 2006 community members made a large fundraising effort which was intended to be used to create a BMX track in Barriere. Committee members became committed to other projects and the project was placed on a back burner. Councillor Kershaw indicated that the purpose of this meeting was to determine if there is enough interest to possibly form a society and make application to the RCMP Foundation for a grant to assist in the building of a BMX facility. Councillor Kershaw noted that the District of Barriere has designated a piece of property that is available for the construction of a track and that it was likely an independent society should be formed to gain access to fundraising, grants and in-kind dollars.

2. ELECTION OF COMMITTEE CHAIR PERSON

Moved by Mrs. Johnson Seconded by Mr. Welz That Councillor Kershaw be nominated as Committee Chair.

CARRIED.

Councillor Kershaw indicated her willingness to act as temporary Chair until such time a formal Committee can be formed.

3. ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Moved by Mrs. Rudd Seconded by Mr. Howe That the Committee approve the June 1, 2010 agenda.

CARRIED

4. GENERAL INTEREST AND COMMITMENT

The Committee viewed a PowerPoint presentation outlining what BMX is and detailed proposed next steps for the Committee.

Councillor Kershaw indicated that at least five people are required in order to form a Society. Mr. Welz indicated the timing of the meeting was unfortunate due to conflicting events within the community. Councillor Kershaw noted that in 2006, over 70 community members expressed interest. Mrs. Johnson noted that in her initial conversations with the American Bicycle Association (ABA) they indicated the Society would need to prove support of the community.

Mrs. Rudd indicated that the last event her son participated in had riders as young as 3 and as old as 67 racing. Mrs. Rudd urged the Committee to consider membership with the ABA rather than the Canadian Cycling Association (CCA) as there would be a greater chance of developing a Provincial and National race circuit with the ABA due to the fact that ABA membership is greater in the interior of B.C. Kamloops, Vernon, Kelowna and Penticton currently hold membership with the ABA. The Kamloops BMX club indicated to Mrs. Rudd that several members of their club would travel to Barriere for weekly races.

Mrs. Johnson questioned if support had been received from the Seniors in the community. Councillor Kershaw indicated Council had not received opposition and noted that she would like to investigate a way to bring Seniors on the Board.

Mrs. Greenwell noted that promoting fitness and healthy nutrition is in such great demand that there may be several funding opportunities available.

5. BMX TRACK COST AND DEVELOPMENT OVERVIEW

Cost and development was briefly discussed. Mrs. Rudd provided Councillor Kershaw with a list of requirements to build a track at today's costs. The estimates were provided from the Kamloops BMX club as they are currently being re-located from McArthur Island to another facility that is in the development process.

Councillor Kershaw indicated that grants may be available through Healthy Living and Sport or Sport BC.

Mrs. Johnson indicated that the District is currently holding a donation that was received in the amount of \$1,000 in trust for a BMX Society. Mention was also made by the members present that it is possible that there are funds being held by the North Thompson Recreation Society and AG Foods.

Councillor Kershaw indicated she would try to attend an upcoming Rec. Society meeting. Mr. Welz indicated he would speak with Ivan Lee of AG Foods and inquire about the money AG may be holding in trust.

6. RCMP FOUNDATION GRANT APPLICATION

Councillor Kershaw indicated a grant application could be made to the RCMP Foundation. Mr. Welz noted that previous grants that were applied for ran into road blocks because Barriere was not incorporated. He indicated that much of the work has been completed and forming a Society and getting a track built would not be as daunting a task as it would appear.

7. OTHER BUSINESS

Mrs. Rudd indicated she would make an invitation to the next meeting and ask that it be distributed through Barriere Elementary School.

Mrs. Rudd indicated the Kamloops Cactus Classic National was June 11-13, 2010 and would bring 500+ riders to Kamloops. She noted that she would bring some video from that race to the next meeting.

Moved by Mr. Welz Seconded by Mr. Howe That the meeting adjourn.
