3. PETITIONS AND DELEGATIONS

- a. Cpl. Welsman, RCMP – Community Policing Update

Cpl. Welsman provided an overview of the Barriere detachment's statistics and priorities since the last report. Key topics noted were:

- The recent letter from a resident requesting a speed limit reduction on neighbourhood roads was discussed. Barriere RCMP does not see that a blanket speed reduction is warranted at this time.
- Reviewed the traffic plan for the upcoming detour through Barriere and will be increasing presence during the construction period.

- The policing population of this Detachment has been projected to have increased to approximately 4800 people. Therefore, an additional officer to add to the compliment of the Department has been requested.
- Glengrove has been the subject of a number of noise complaints relating to fireworks in that area.
- There has been a BC wide catalytic converter theft increase which Barriere is also experiencing.
