It was asked of him what the size of the planned reservoir was and it was answered that its exact specs are not yet known but it would be to a municipal standard and large enough to be able to accommodate some growth, if need be.

It was also asked what would be required if an owner of one of the 1acre parcels wanted to subdivide in the future. The Corporate Officer answered that the applicant would have to make an application to rezone for a site-specific amendment to permit a smaller lot size. This process is a full rezoning process with a Public Hearing and a successful Zoning Bylaw amendment adoption.
