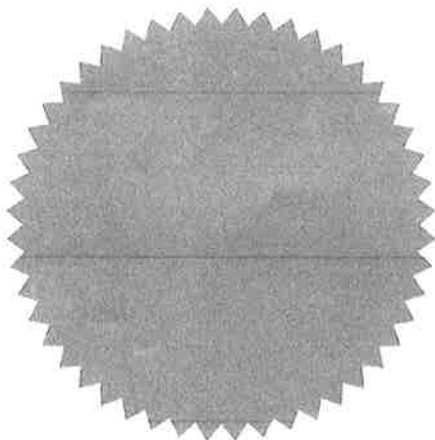

### SOCIETY'S PURPOSES

The name of the Society is Barriere Trails Society.

The purposes of the Society are: To build, promote and maintain trails in and around the community of Barriere. We strive to connect our communities and to enhance our citizens' and visitors' outdoor recreation opportunities. The following details our purposes and more specifically with applicable activities:

- a) To encourage non motorized outdoor activities(eg. playing, walking, hiking, running and cycling) to promote healthy living for individuals and collectively on a community level.
- b) To foster awareness, participation and use of local walking and hiking trails.
- c) To encourage local citizens to build, maintain and improve local trails.
- d) To collaborate with other societies and organizations, forming partnerships to achieve the goals listed above.
- e) If the Barriere Trails Society ceases to exist, then the funds within the society will be sent to the Barriere Outdoor Recreation Society.

# New Barriere Trails Society is hard at work

The newly formed Barriere Trails Society (BTS) is attracting new members and also some donated time, equipment and materials to kick off this first season of trail work by the society.

On April 23 and 24, Ryan Fadear from Fadear Sand and Gravel in Barriere donated a machine and gravel to the Glentanna Ridge Trail project the society is focused on. President of the society, Harry Waldron, explained in a short time, the society has volunteered over 150 man hours and multiple machine hours to clean up and FireSmart Glentanna Ridge Trail.

"It already has an urban forest trailhead with trees for summer shade and a majestic view of our town," said Waldron.

Waldron and his wife, Connie, moved to Barriere from the Lower Mainland

to retire and be closer to their grandchildren with a love for the outdoor recreation offered in the North Thompson.

"Last year I joined the Barriere Outdoor Club and recently became a director. I have hiked Barriere Forks trails and cross country

the idea of forming a society. I asked residents to my house to address trail projects like signage, developing a river circuit loop and to promote Barriere trails. I didn't know if I would get three or twenty-three. On March 11 all nine that attended that first meeting

became directors under the B.C. Society's Act." The president describes the group as diverse coming from careers in forestry, education, health, sports and municipal parks and all having a common vision.

The Barriere Trail Soci-

ety board includes: Harry Waldron - President, Brian Bondar - Vice President, Dr. J. Cleland - Vice President, John Peterson - Secretary, William Jensen - Treasurer, Rachel Jensen - Director, Jordan Rainer - Director, D'Arcy Bach - Director, Ben Thiesen - Director.

The Barriere Trails Society's vision is "to build, promote, and maintain trails in and around Barriere. We strive to connect our communities and to enhance our citizens and visitors outdoor recreation opportunities." The BTS encourages non-motorized activities like walking, cycling, bird watching, and hiking, to connect the community to outdoor recreation in the area.

Recently the Lower North Thompson Community Forest Society (LNTCFS) donated two picnic tables for use at the Glentanna trailhead along with Fadear Sand

and Gravel's generous donation of 40 yards of gravel and two days of machine time. Local, Cory Jensen assisted in doing the initial leveling and root removal with his tractor and Gilbert Smith Forest Products Ltd. donated lumber for trail signs and additional projects. The two picnic tables soon to arrive from LNTCFS are not yet in place but will be installed at the start of the Glentanna trail just off Dunn Lake Road. BTS director Ben Thiesen has given the group permission to develop the trail and picnic area on his land.

The society meets on the first Wednesday of the month at 6:30 p.m. at the Station House Restaurant in Barriere and welcomes new member volunteers.
