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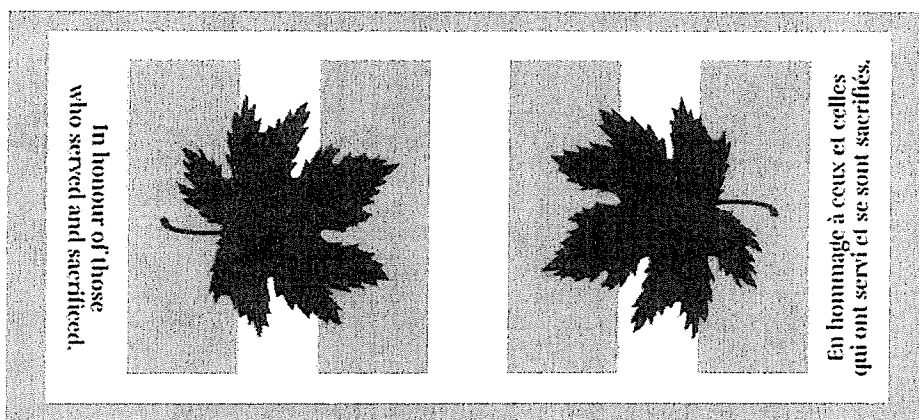
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Commemorative Crosswalk



Note: Community Commemorative Crosswalks are coordinated at the local level. Individuals wishing to honour Veterans through a commemorative crosswalk should contact their local Legion Branch or their City Hall to look at the feasibility.

During the Remembrance period and throughout the year, a growing number of Legion Branches and communities are developing commemorative crosswalks to honour Veterans. The Remembrance Poppy is a Legion trademark and may not be used in any situation where it may be trod upon. To support Branches and communities with their crosswalk initiatives, the Legion is providing an alternative commemorative crosswalk stencil

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3. Follow the instructions to size and prepare your stencils and paint the Crosswalk.

Commemorative Crosswalk Design Template

This stylized maple leaf honours the service of all of who stood on guard for Canada and is supported by Canadian Heritage for community use. Communities are advised to not include red bands on either side of the maple leaf, to avoid being mistaken for the National Flag of Canada.

Paint for Commemorative Crosswalks

Crosswalks must be painted with specialized traffic marking paint, not regular exterior paint. Municipalities and provinces set the standards, so please contact your local public works or transportation department for approval and guidance.

Paint types include traffic marking acrylic, thermoplastic, or epoxy/MMA, often with glass beads for visibility.

Colours: Approved paints are available in custom colours. Provide the municipality with these Legion standards:

- White: Pantone White / RGB 255, 255, 255 / CMYK 0, 0, 0, 0
- Red: Pantone 186 / RGB 206, 17, 45 / CMYK 0, 92, 78, 19
- Grey: Pavement colour

Already have a Commemorative Crosswalk?

If your community already has a Commemorative Crosswalk, wonderful! Please note, the Poppy should never be used on a crosswalk or where the symbol of Remembrance can be trod upon. A Poppy Crosswalk must be replaced. There is no need to change other crosswalk symbols used to honour Veterans, however if, over time, it needs to be renewed, feel free to use the new template.

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Commemorative Crosswalk

Instructions

1. Open Files

Open the stencil files using Adobe Illustrator.

2. Customize Stencils If Required

The standard templates are optimized to fit a 99" wide crosswalk with stripes that are 21" to 30" deep (*sample is shown at 21" deep*). They are sized at:

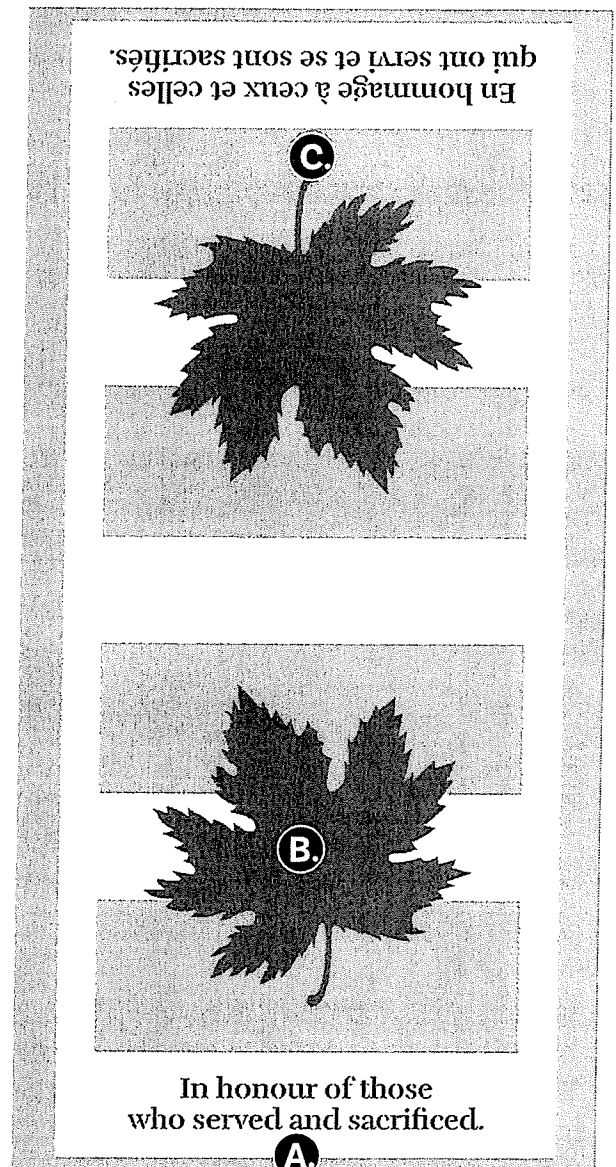
- **Text:** 71" x 12.5" (EN) / 85" x 12.5" (FR)
- **Maple Leaf:** 52.5" x 65"

If the dimensions of the memorial crosswalk in your community differ from those above, the stencils are provided in vector format so they can be easily scaled to fit based on the positioning guidelines in step 3.

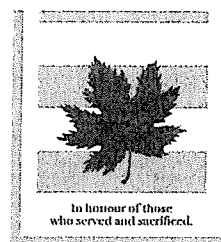
3. Positioning the Stencils

The stenciled elements should be positioned as follows:

- Centre the **English text stencil** over the first white (painted) bar of the crosswalk. Fill with black paint.
- Centre the **maple leaf stencil** over the next three bars. If the crosswalk's spacing is uneven, adjust the leaf's position as needed (see Positioning Option B). Fill with red paint, matching Pantone 186.
- On the opposite end of the crosswalk, repeat steps 1-2 using the **French text** and **leaf stencils**.
